Classes will begin with the ritual "moment of silence" followed by calisthenics and stretching. Individual hand and foot techniques will be taught first, then combinations of movements, leading to more complex sequences called "kata." There will be absolutely no contact in class unless and until a student achieves the rank of Yellow belt, at which time contact between the student and the instructor will be allowed in a strictly regulated environment. Uniforms are not required until rank is achieved. Class is open to male and female students.

This is a continuation Spanish course from the fall semester. This year we will be using the Rosetta Stone curriculum. This online resource will be available for purchase through ENAECT at a cost of \$75 per language and will give you 1 year of access to Rosetta Stone Online. The lessons, which will be done at home on computers, include listening exercises, reading, dictation, and pronunciation practice. These will be completed Monday thru Thursday spending between 30-45 minutes each day. On Fridays we will continue with practicing what has been learned through the week with speaking exercises, games, music and attention to grammar. I believe that this will be a very rewarding and fun curriculum and that the students will come out speaking and understanding the language.

I have over a dozen line dances; some of them are "beginner" meaning that once they are mastered, I then teach an "intermediate" version of the same dance, and we don't revisit the beginner version again. Others are taught in their final form. By the 3rd week of class, we should be able to run through the 9 important dances reasonably well. After that point, I use the Line Dances as "warm-up" before we pair up and start working on Partner Dances. We will concentrate on Swing, Salsa, Waltz and Foxtrot. That way, the students will be prepared for almost any social environment whether it inclines toward formal music, Rock, C&W or Tejano. As part of the curriculum I try to instill the proper etiquette and courtesy towards your dance partner. It is always nice if the class has an equal number of guys and girls, but that has seldom happened!
